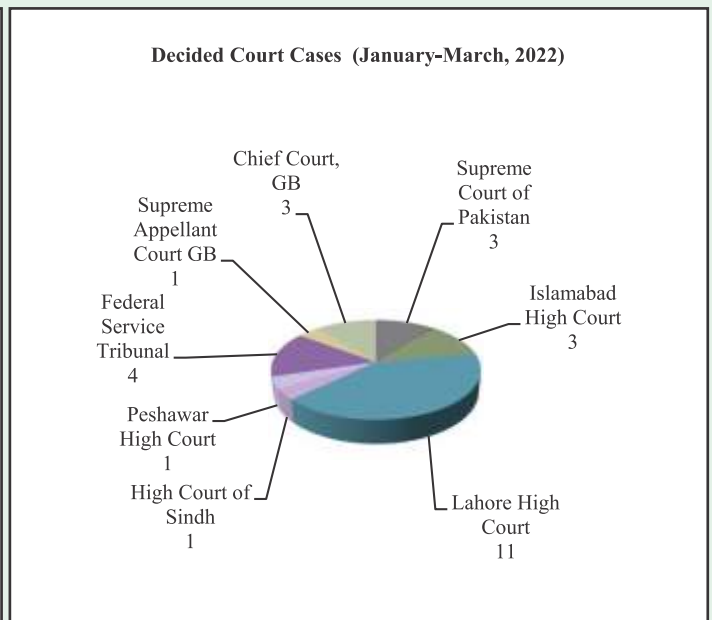
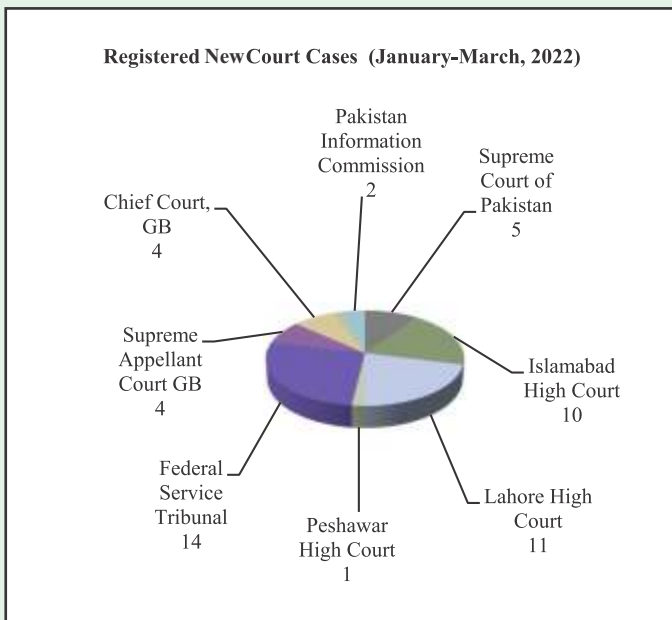

**G. 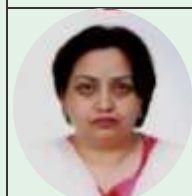

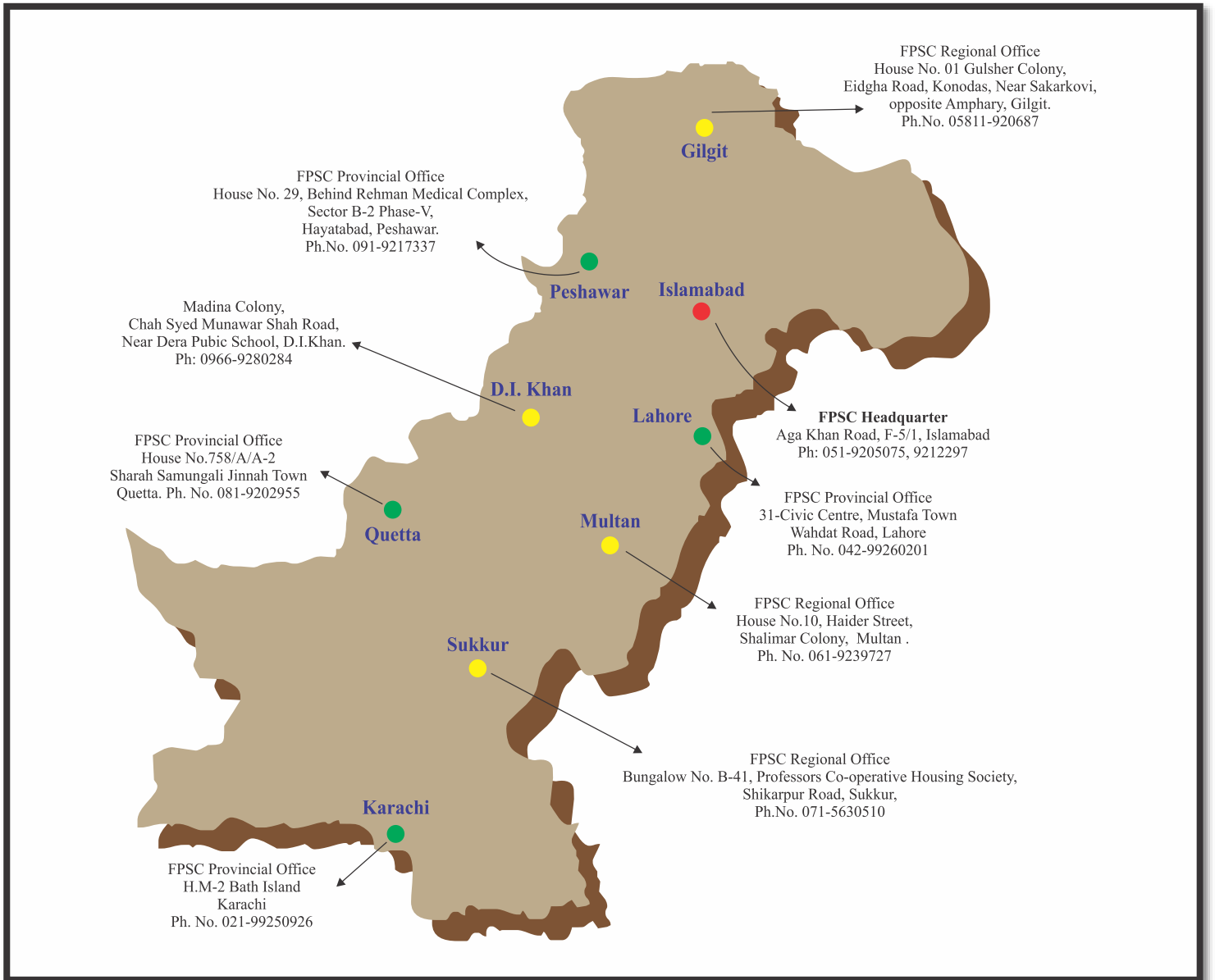
